Working with customers to keep the Byker Estate clean, safe and well-maintained is a top priority for us. In this newsletter you'll find details about our clean-up day of action, CCTV installation plans, skip schedule, litter picks, and a multitude of waste disposal options available to you in and around the estate.

LOVE WHERE YOU LIVE AND HELP US LITTER PICK

On Wednesday 18 September, we're holding a day of action to tidy up the estate.

Led by Karbon's Grounds Maintenance Team, we'll be working together to rid the estate of litter and fly tipping. Would you like to join the team and get involved?

We will be providing litter picking equipment on the day.

We will also be providing eight skips throughout the estate so you can dispose of bulky items.

Did you know we provide skips four times a year to dispose of your bulky items for free?

CCTV Installation

Did you know it is illegal to deposit any waste onto land in Byker?

Fly tipping is having a negative effect on our neighbourhood and we take this illegal behaviour very seriously.

We're pleased to tell you we are installing new temporary CCTV cameras on the estate. These will be positioned in fly tipping hotspot areas over the coming weeks, acting as a deterrent to any potential unlawful activity and recording those who do dispose of waste illegally. We will take action against those who break the law and fly tip on our estate.



Recycling

Looking after your bins

If your wheelie bin has a damaged lid or damaged wheels, the Council may be able to repair it free of charge. Please request your free repair: www.envirocall.newcastle.gov.uk/

Side waste

Waste is collected by the Council. All rubbish should be inside a bin, with the lid closed. Unfortunately, we can't collect any side waste, and you may receive a fixed penalty notice (between £75 and £200) if you put loose waste next to your bin.

Enforcement

Fixed Penalty Notices and fines are issued for environmental offences including fly tipping across the estate.

Please remember that if you see any fly tipping, report it to us. With your help, we can rid the estate of illegal waste.

Your guide to recycling at home in Newcastle



Mixed glass (bottles and jars, rinsed) Keep glass separate and only put it in the **black** caddy



















Please wash and squash your items and replace tops and lids on bottles and jars to keep recycling clean and dry.





Don't put recycling into plastic bags







Textiles

We want to support the re-use of textiles. Please take your textiles to charity shops or donation banks which can be found throughout Newcastle.

Electrical items

Do not place electrical items or vapes in any bin.

We collect small electrical items free of charge from your doorstep or you can drop them off at one of our library drop off points.

Reuse Your Old Items

Do you have unwanted items, such as furniture, that could still be used by someone else?

There are some great ways you can donate furniture, right on our doorstep!

The British Heart Foundation

Bulky Waste

If your bulky items cannot be reused, there are other ways you can dispose of them.

Byker Recycling centre

The council's Byker Household Waste Recycling Centre will take the majority of household waste. Open from 8am to 6pm Monday to Sunday, you do not need to book an appointment to visit. You will need to take proof of being a Newcastle resident with you, for example a council tax bill, and a form of photo I.D such as a passport.

Newcastle City Council currently has a 25% discount on all listed item prices for bulky collections and prices start from £10

Please be aware, you cannot access the centre on foot, and if you are using a larger vehicle, you may need to apply for a permit.

Bulky Waste Collection

Bulky waste items are domestic waste items that you cannot dispose of in your general waste bin.

Bulky waste could include things like:

- · heavy items such as a sofa.
- large items such as domestic white goods including fridges, washing machines and cookers.
- smaller items such as an ironing board or a TV unit.

Keeping our estate tidy – ways to get involved

We work together tirelessly to keep the Byker Estate tidy. There are a few ways that customers can get involved to help maintain the areas around your homes.

Litter picks

Litter picks are held on the first Tuesday of every month. We meet outside the Byker Community Trust office, 17 Raby Cross at 10am, and post reminders on Facebook (search Byker Community Trust) beforehand so keep an eye out for our next one.

Estate Walkabouts

Our estate walkabouts are a great opportunity to meet with your Karbon Neighbourhood Housing Officer and address any questions, concerns or suggestions about the area around your home.

We currently hold the walkabouts quarterly and advertise our upcoming ones on the Byker Community Trust Facebook page (search Byker Community Trust).

Grounds Maintenance Inspectors

Have your say on the way we maintain the grass, hedging, planters etc. around the estate.

Our Grounds Maintenance Inspectors work alongside our Grounds Maintenance Team to provide feedback on the service you receive as customers. It involves filling out a short survey after work has been carried out on the estate, which we can then use to make impactful changes to the service we provide you as customers.





Our Grounds Maintenance Team litter pick and maintain the environment on the estate across eight zones, working in your neighbourhood every two weeks.
